- 1. Jesus is Condemned to Death
- 2. Jesus Takes up His Cross
- 3. Jesus Falls the First Time
- 4. Jesus Meets His Sorrowful Mother
- 5. Simon of Cyrene Helps Jesus Carry the Cross
- 6. Veronica Wipes the Face of Jesus
- 7. Jesus Falls a Second Time
- 8. Jesus Meets the Women of Jerusalem
- 9. Jesus Falls the Third Time
- 10. Jesus is Stripped of His Garments
- 11. Jesus is Nailed to the Cross.
- 12. Jesus Dies on the Cross

Sometimes a $15^{\rm th}$ station is included that reflects on the joy of the Resurrection of Jesus.

How to Pray the Rosary

We hold the crucifix in our hands as we pray the Sign of the Cross and the Apostle's Creed.

Following the crucifix there is a single bead followed by a set of 3 beads and a single bead. The Lord's Prayer is prayed as we hold the first single bead and a Hail Mary at each bead in the set of 3 that follows. Then we pray the Glory Be to the Father. On the next single bead, we say the first mystery and pray the Lord's Prayer.

There are 5 sets of 10 beads; each set is called a decade. We pray a Hail Mary on each bead of the decade. The Glory Be to the Father is prayed at the end of each decade. Between the decades is a single bead on which we say the next Mystery and pray the Lord's Prayer. After the last decade, we pray the Hail, Holy Queen. We end by holding the Crucifix in our hands as we pray the Sign of the Cross.

The Joyful Mysteries (Monday & Saturday)

- 1. The Annunciation Mary learns that she has been chosen to be the mother of Jesus.
- The Visitation Mary visits Elizabeth, who tells Mary that she will always be remembered.
- 3. The Nativity Jesus is born in a stable in Bethlehem.
- 4. The Presentation Mary and Joseph bring the infant Jesus to the Temple to present him to God.
- 5. The Finding of Jesus in the Temple Jesus is found in the Temple discussing his faith with the teachers.

The Luminous Mysteries (Thursday)

- 1. The Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan God the Father proclaims that Jesus is his beloved Son.
- 2. The Wedding Feast at Cana At Mary's request, Jesus performs his first miracle.
- 3. The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God Jesus calls all to conversion and service to the kingdom.
- 4. The Transfiguration of Jesus Jesus is revealed in glory to Peter, James and John.
- 5. The Institution of the Eucharist Jesus offers his Body and Blood at the Last Supper.

The Sorrowful Mysteries (Tuesday & Friday)

- 1. The Agony in the Garden Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane on the night before he dies.
- 2. The Scourging at the Pillar Jesus is lashed with whips.
- 3. The Crowning with Thorns Jesus is mocked and crowned with thorns.
- 4. The Carrying of the Cross Jesus carries the cross that will be used to crucify him.
- 5. The Crucifixion Jesus is nailed to the cross and dies.

The Glorious Mysteries (Wednesday & Sunday)

- 1. The Resurrection God the Father raises Jesus from the dead.
- 2. The Ascension Jesus returns to his Father in Heaven.
- The Coming of the Holy Spirit The Holy Spirit comes to bring new life to the disciples.
- 4. The Assumption of Mary At the end of her life on earth, Mary is taken body and soul into Heaven.
- 5. The Coronation of Mary Mary is crowned as Queen of Heaven and Earth.

Confiteor

I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Holy, Holy, Holy (Sanctus)

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Gloria

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will.

We praise you,

we bless you,

we adore you,

we glorify you,

we give you thanks for your great glory,

Lord God, heavenly King,

O God, almighty Father.

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us;

you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer;

you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Guide for Making an Individual Confession

- Begin by making the sign of the cross & saying "Bless me Father for I have sinned. It has been (how long?) since my last confession."
- The priest may give you a blessing at this time. If he has already done so, continue by confessing your sins to the best of your ability: "These are my sins..."
- You may conclude by saying: "For these and all my sins, I am sorry."
- The priest may offer some advice and assign you your penance. He may then ask you to pray the Act of Contrition.
- The priest will then grant you Absolution to which you respond Amen.
- The priest may say "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good." You respond: "His mercy endures forever!" The Priest may then say: "Go in Peace."
- After confession, pray or perform your penance as soon as possible. It is a good practice to pray an extra prayer for your priest-confessor.

The Order & Meaning of the Mass

The Mass is the high point of the Christian life, and it always follows a set order.

Introductory Rites We prepare to celebrate the Eucharist.

<u>Entrance Chant</u> We gather as a community praising God in song.

<u>Greeting</u> We pray the Sign of the Cross, recognizing the presence of Christ in the community.

<u>Penitential Act</u> We acknowledge our sins and ask God for mercy.

<u>Gloria</u> We praise God in song by singing or saying the Gloria.

<u>Collect Prayer</u> The priest gathers all our prayers into one.

Liturgy of the Word We hear the story of God's plan for Salvation.

<u>First Reading</u> We listen to God's Word, usually from the Old Testament.

<u>Responsorial Psalm</u> We respond to God's Word, usually in song.

<u>Second Reading</u> We listen to God's Word, usually from the New Testament.

<u>Gospel Acclamation</u> We sing or pray "Alleluia!" to praise God for the Good News. During Lent a different acclamation is used.

<u>Gospel Reading</u> We stand to acclaim Christ present in the Gospel.

<u>Homily</u> The priest or deacon explains God's Word.

<u>Profession of Faith</u> We proclaim our faith through the Creed.

<u>Prayer of the Faithful</u> We pray for our needs and the needs of others.

Liturgy of the Eucharist

We celebrate the meal that Jesus instituted at the Last Supper and remember the sacrifice he made for us.

<u>Presentation and Preparation of the Gifts</u> We bring gifts of bread and wine to the altar.

<u>Prayer over the Offerings</u> The priest prays that God will accept our sacrifice.

<u>Eucharistic Prayer</u> This prayer of thanksgiving is the center and high point of the entire celebration.

<u>Preface Dialoque</u> We give thanks and praise to God.

<u>Preface Acclamation (or Holy, Holy, Holy)</u> We sing an acclamation of praise.

<u>Institution Narrative</u> The bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

<u>The Mystery of Faith</u> We proclaim Jesus' Death and Resurrection.

Communion Rite We prepare to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

<u>The Lord's Prayer</u> We pray the Lord's Prayer.

<u>Sign of Peace</u> We offer one another Christ's peace.

<u>Lamb of God</u> We pray for forgiveness, mercy and peace.

<u>Communion</u> We receive the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

<u>Prayer after Communion</u> We pray that the Eucharist will strengthen us to live as Jesus Christ did.

Concluding Rites At the conclusion of Mass, we are blessed and sent forth.

<u>Final Blessing</u> We receive God's blessing.

<u>Dismissal</u> We go in peace to glorify the Lord in our lives.
